### Minimum Requirements

Bachelor's degree in social work or counseling with three (3) years of counseling experience; or any equivalent combination of training and experience. Must hold a License of Social Worker (L.S.W.) or License of Professional Counselor (L.P.C.) in the State of Ohio.

Preferred: Advanced/Master's degree preferred.

Must possess and maintain a valid Ohio driver's license and have ready access to an insured automobile.

### Application Process

This is a non-competitive, classified position. The Personnel Review Commission (PRC) will check your application to make sure you meet the minimum qualifications. If you do, the PRC will put your name on an eligibility list. To fill this opening, the PRC sends the hiring department and Human Resources (HR) a certified eligibility list. HR helps the hiring department decide who from the certified list to follow up with for interviews and then a job offer.

Most of our communication with candidates is through email. Regularly check the email address you gave us in your job profile. Watch your Spam folder, just in case.

If we offer you a job, you must pass a drug screen and background check before the offer becomes final. Prior criminal convictions

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do not automatically disqualify you from employment; the County looks at criminal convictions on a case-by-case basis using the guidelines in Chapter 306 of the County Code.
